- Sub:** Introduction of Internal Assessment System for Under Graduates Law Degree Programme.
- Ref:** 1. The 69<sup>th</sup> Syndicate Sub-Committee meeting dtd. 21.07.2018.  
2. Approval of 70<sup>th</sup> Syndicate meeting held on 04.08.2018, item No. 10.  
3. Approval of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, dtd: 21.08.2018.

With reference to the above subject, this is to inform the Principals of all Affiliated Law Colleges of KSLU that, unless otherwise provided for in each course carrying 100 marks, 20 marks shall be awarded by way of internal assessment. The end of the semester examination shall be conducted for 80 marks. A student should secure a minimum of 40% of the marks in the end semester examination to be declared as pass in that paper provided, he has secured a minimum of 40 marks in that paper along with internal assessment marks. That is, a student has to secure a minimum of 32 marks in each paper in the end semester examination. These 20 marks shall be awarded as per the modalities below:

### Modalities for Awarding Internal Assessment Marks

- The 20 marks for internal assessment shall be apportioned as under.
  - One test- 10 marks
  - Assignment- 5 marks
  - Seminar based on assignments- 5 marks
- The test shall be conducted in the 10<sup>th</sup> week of the semester.
- The student shall write one essay answer for 7 marks and one short note/ problem for 3 marks.
- The test shall be for one hour.
- There shall be two essay type questions of which student shall answer one and two short note questions of which students shall answer one.
- Topics for assignments shall be based on the syllabus prescribed for the course. The course teachers shall allocate topics to students in the second week of the semester. The assignment may be in the form of a statute analysis, case comment, essay, research on a topic or a socio-legal survey. It shall be in the hand writing of the student and he/ she



1. a) Divorce was unknown concept in the Hindu marriage. It was a sacrament. According to Manu the concept of divorce was not there, it was believed that the bond of husband and wife is unbreakable and it was sacred.

According to Mitakshara a husband & wife could only separate by the mutual consent not by any other means.

But after the legislation and introduction of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 many grounds were given for divorce. Those are:

1) Adultery (Section 13(1)):

Adultery means when a person has ~~the~~ sex voluntarily with other rather than his/her spouse. The spouse can claim for divorce even if it happens once.

Case:

Swapna Gore V. Sadananda Gore.

Here the wife found that the husband was coming home late and there was a change in his behavior. The court granted the decree of divorce stating sometimes it is difficult to produce accurate evidence & circumstantial evidences shall be considered.

ii) Cruelty:

Cruelty is also one of the grounds for divorce under Hindu Marriage Act, 1955. Cruelty shall be both physical or mental. The spouse may feel danger to his/her life.

Here in cruelty the mens rea of the abuser is not taken into consideration.

There are few points to consider here:

1. There should be constant abuse.
2. There should be threat to their life.
- 3.



iii) Desertion:

Desertion is when ~~the~~ one of the spouses leaves the matrimonial relationship and obligation with an intention to not continue the marriage and not live with the spouse. It is considered desertion only after a year of the spouse moving out.

In Bipin Chandra V. Prabavati,

The husband went to England because of work, meantime the wife and the friend of the husband shared letters, the father of the husband finds those letters and when asked about it the wife refuses to say anything and leaves the matrimonial house & goes and lives with her parents. When the husband asked for decree of divorce under desertion the court refuses the petition.

#### iv) Renunciation of the world:

When a spouse renounces the world, he/she gives up everything and takes up Sanyasatna. Just wearing clothes or changing names, he/she will not become a sanyasi they should perform rituals required.

#### vi) Conversion:

When one of the spouses converts to other religion their spouse can ask for divorce.

#### vii) Not continuing the marriage after judicial separation:

The husband and wife decides to not continue the marriage after judicial separation they can ask for divorce.

(6) ii) Rape, bestiality:

If the husband is convicted for rape or he shows behavior of a beast and constantly abuses the wife can claim divorce.

iii) Pre-repudiation of marriage:

Here if the girl is married before 15 years she can claim for divorce.

In one of the decided case law, a wife claimed for divorce on the grounds that she was repudiated before the age of 15.

## Introduction:

Hindu coparceners who have interest in the co-parcenary property by birth, their interest in the coparcenary property is uncertain and undefined so long as they remain joint, because all the coparceners enjoy equally along with others. However, the unity may be broken by effecting partition among the coparceners.

Partition is an act by which coparcener severs his relations with joint family and loses his status of coparcener and becomes an independent individual from the links of joint family. An important consequence of such partition is that the share of the coparcener or coparceners seeking partition which is still partition, uncertain, fluctuating and unpredictable becomes specific and definite, as a result of partition, and thus allotted to the respective members.

## Meaning of Partition:

The Mitakshara lays down: "Partition is the adjustment of the diverse interests regarding the whole, by distributing them into particular portions of the aggregate." Thus, according to Mitakshara is used in two distinct senses; firstly, the adjustment into specific shares the diverse rights of the different members

according to the whole of family property; Secondly, the severance of joint status, with the legal consequences resulting therefrom. Partition has been defined as "the crystallization of the fluctuating interest of a coparcenary into a specific share in the joint family estate."

The Karnataka High Court in *B. Bassamma V. K.B. Sadyajathappa* has held that severance of status is brought about when shares of co-parceners are crystallized by defining their share and once that is done the mere fact that they continued to stay together in the same house would not by itself make any legal impact on the severance of the same status already brought about as subsequent conduct of the parties would only pertain to the domain of mode of enjoyment of the properties.

Where there is no joint property to divide, there can be a partition by the mere declaration "I am separate from thee" for a partition and ~~reasons for~~ ~~se~~ merely indicates state of mind. Existence of property is not essential for partition, and reasons for severance are immaterial.

This is possible only when they completely trust that mediator will not act in any one's favour particularly & will work in the best interest of both the parties.

### Neutrality:

The faith reposed by the parties in the mediator at time of his appointment needs to be maintained not only if the entire proceeding is over but also thereafter. This faith should not only exist but also seem to be existing all the time. A mediator should never give an impression that he is leaning in favour of any of the parties. This neutrality should get reflected not just inside the mediation room but also outside. It is the neutrality, which re-inforces trust.

### c) Confidentiality:

The parties to the dispute approach the mediator with the hope that what ever would come to the knowledge of mediator during the proceedings will remain with him only. Sometimes the disputes on the face of it look to be entirely different from what they actually are. The parties divulge a lot of personal details to the mediator in confidence that they will not be shared with not just the other party but also with no one else.

### d) Listen patiently:

When the parties walk into mediation they carry a lot of emotional baggage. They look for an opportunity that someone hears them. Once a party goes with a feeling that he has been heard to his satisfaction, a mediator may

Mediation is a form of alternative dispute resolution, a way of resolving disputes between two or more parties with concrete effects.

Typically, a third party, the mediator, assists the parties to negotiate a settlement. Disputants may mediate disputes in a variety of domains, such as commercial, legal, diplomatic, workplace, community and family matters.

The process is private and confidential, possibly enforced by law. Mediation can be used to resolve disputes of any magnitude.

#### Qualities of mediator.

There are a few basic qualities which every mediator should possess. They are:

##### a) Trust:

One can work as a mediator so long as he or she enjoys the trust of the parties. The parties can pick a mediator only when they have a trust in the mediator or they have a reason to believe that they can trust him. The reason for it is simple. Although more often than not a mediator follows a structured process for resolving the dispute but he or she does not maintain any formal record of what transpires in the proceedings. The parties communicate to the mediator in confidence that their secrets will not be revealed to others unless he or she himself or herself so desires.

# Introduction

- "Healthy Citizens are the greatest asset any country can have"-Winston Churchill.
- In India every year people (130 crore-Population) spend around 5 lakh crore as expenditure on health i.e. it may be on hospitals, Medicines or diagnostics<sup>1</sup> i.e. 5% of India's GDP. Among which medicines emerged as a principal component of total health expenses—72% in rural areas and 68% in urban area<sup>2</sup>.

# Constitution Guarantees Right to Health

- Right to Health is the basic fundamental right derived from Article 21 of Indian Constitution



# Generic Drug-A boon to people

- "A Generic Drug is a medication created to be the same as an existing approved brand-name drug in dosage form, safety, strength, route of administration, quality and performance characteristics<sup>4</sup>."

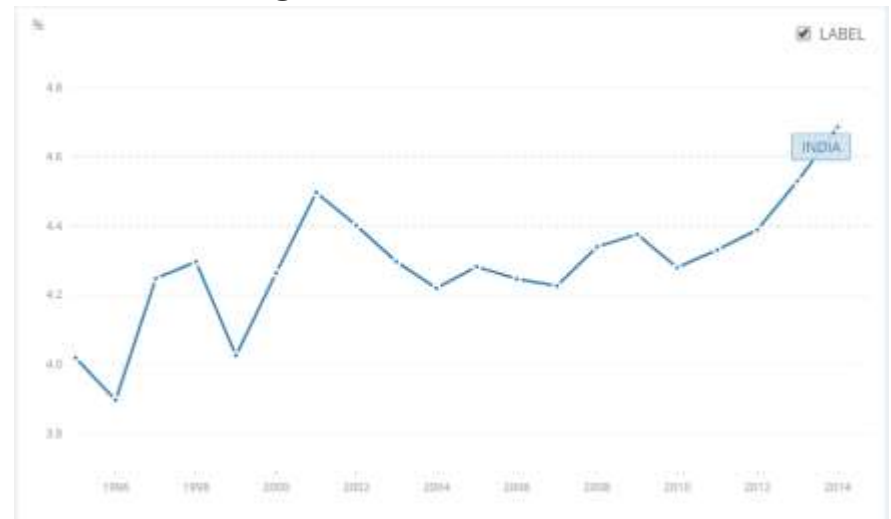

# Judiciary supports

## **Bayer Corporation v. Natco Pharma Ltd. (Natco v. Bayer)**

- Bayer's plea dismissed by the Intellectual Property Appellate Board.<sup>16</sup> The Intellectual Property Appellate Board (IPAB) on Monday upheld the grant of compulsory licence (CL) to the Hyderabad-based Natco Pharma Limited, a generic drug maker, to produce and market Nexavar, a patented cancer drug of multinational pharma major Bayer Corporation.

- The Indian Pharmaceuticals Industry (IPI) earns around 70 per cent of its revenues from sale of generic drugs and generates around **50 per cent of its revenues from exports.**



# Unfortunately

- Studies and our survey says **5% patients know about generic drugs** in India
- Except Doctors and Nurses 60% of non Medical staff and 95% of the patients did not know about it.<sup>19-21</sup>

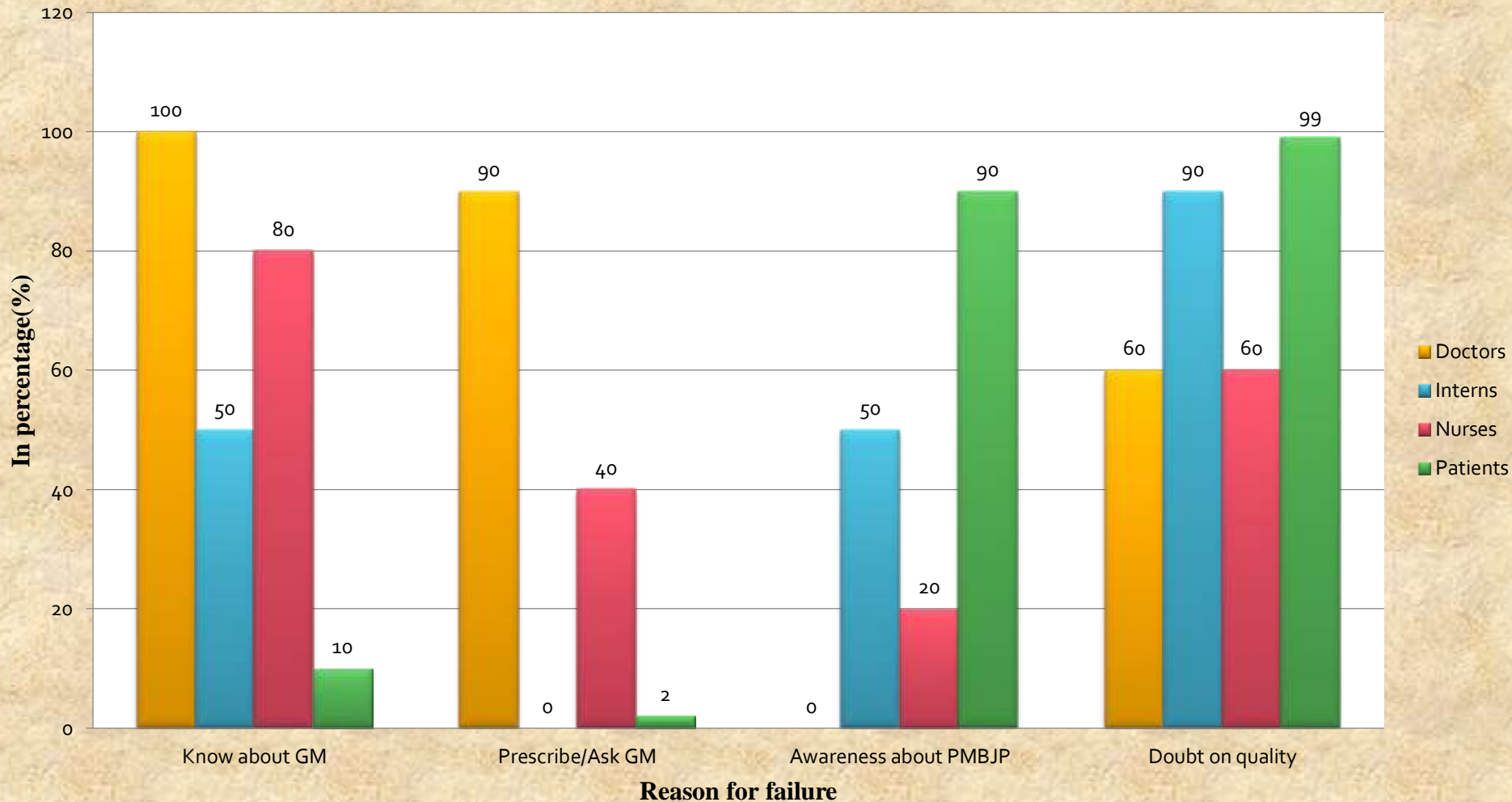
## Diabetic Drugs Comparative Price List

# Reason for failure

## 1. NON-PRESCRIPTION OF GENERIC MEDICINES:

On Sep 21, 2016 - Central Govt by Medical Council of India amended Clause 1.5 Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics Regulations, 2002 that - "Every Physician should prescribe drugs with Generic names legibly and preferably in Capital letters and he/she shall ensure that there is a national prescription and use of drugs". Hon'ble PM Narendra Modi in a speech (In Surat) asked doctors to prescribe Generic Medicine. BUT THIS IS NOT EFFECTIVE AS WE CAN SEE IN THE SURVEY.

# Reason for failure

## 2. DOUBT ON QUALITY

Doctors themselves doubt about the quality of Generic Medicine prepared by Government.

As 60% doctors in the survey doubt the quality of Generic medicine, it's is no wonder that 99% of patients doubt on its quality.

# Reason for Failure

## 2. DOUBT ON QUALITY

**Quality Control:** BPPI would ensure that only quality drugs are supplied through the Jan Aushadhi stores as per Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940.



# Reason for Failure

## 3. LACK OF AWARENESS

- 45 patients among 50 i.e. **90% do not know** Generic Medicine.
- People are **typically following the prescription** of doctors, which is mainly influenced by various marketing strategies adopted by pharmaceutical companies promoting branded drugs(No Choice).
- There is **no facility for the common man to find, on his own, a generic substitute** which is equally safe and efficacious.

# Solution

- **To counter lack of awareness –**

**Promotions** should be made initially in **private television channels, Cinema Halls, posters** should be pasted, and in all the places where Public are more easily attracted.

- **To counter Doubt on Quality –**

**Access** should also be given to Public to **cross check the quality of Generic Medicine** through Drug Control Boards and NABL accredited laboratories.

# Solution

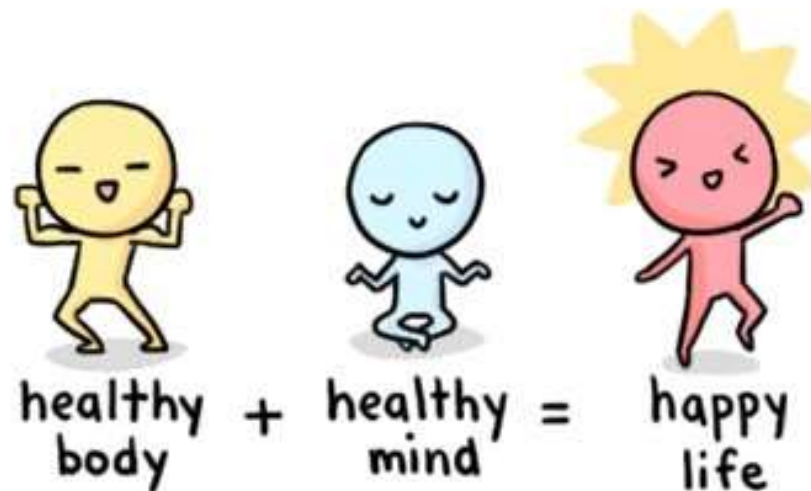
- **To Counter Non Prescription by Doctors-**

Executive **Inspectors** should be **appointed** for every **100 hospitals and Clinics**, where he/she should be inspecting all the Hospitals and Clinics to ensure that doctors are **prescribing Generic Medicine**, **if not stringent actions** should be taken on him.



# Conclusion

- For which government has to **increase the present budget of Rs. 38 crore** being sanctioned.<sup>23</sup> Thus there is necessity to create awareness among Public about their Rights i.e. Right to health; there by **political, economical and social development** can be seen in the Country.



# INTRODUCTION

- ▶ The drugs and cosmetics laws in India as conceived in legislations and policies such as Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940, National Drug Policy etc., help in securing the rights of consumers of drugs and imposing corresponding duties on manufacturers of such drugs.



- 
- Throughout history, there has been a need for balancing the needs and safety of consumers with the interests of manufacturers and sellers. In cases of pharmaceutical industry, due to the nature and diversity of the industry, it is vital for regulations and policies- in order to maintain the balance between interests of members of the industry- manufacturers and suppliers and consumers.



# Rights of consumers and corresponding duties

- The Drug/ pharmaceutical market is unique in the nature of the product and manufacturing process.
- The industry is susceptible to adulteration of products, misbranding of products, concealing of information from consumers, false advertising, pricing detrimental to consumers and exploitation of consumers.
- Therefore there is need for strict and proper regulation in relation to protection of consumers' rights



The major Rights of consumers and corresponding Duties of manufacturers, arise out of two concepts in the Pharmaceutical industry- safety and quality of drugs and affordable pricing





# Safety and Quality Control

- ▶ According to the Consumer Protection Act 1986, the consumer right to safety is referred to as 'right to be protected against marketing of goods and services which are hazardous to life and property'.
- ▶ Consumers have the right to safe, good-quality goods which are not spurious or adulterated. Thus, the drugs in the market must be safe to consume.




# Right of Consumers

- The definition of 'standard quality' is elaborated under Schedule 2 of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, with regard to the classes of the drug.
- In essence, the schedule provides for the international quality of drugs by various International Organisations' standards, as a standard product in the market.
- Thus, the Act aims to protect the consumer's right to quality drugs which are safe to consume.



# Duties of Manufacturer



- ▶ As per Section 18(a), manufacture of drugs has to be mandatorily of standard quality as defined above. It states that no person shall himself or by any other person on his behalf, manufacture for sale or for distribution, or sell, or stock or exhibit or offer for sale or distribute any drug which is not of a standard quality, or is misbranded, adulterated or spurious.
- 






# Duties of Manufacturers

- Manufacturers have the duty to produce 'standard quality' drugs and also have to have appropriate licenses for manufacturing.
- Conditions for procuring a license are restrictive, to serve the purpose of quality control. Section 71, 74, 76 and Section 78, along with Schedule M of the Drugs and Cosmetics Rules, enlist the conditions




- Section 18(c) prohibits manufacture for sale, by any person or company, which does not have a license. Section 27(b) provides for the penalty of producing drugs without a valid license.
  - Quality of the procuring raw materials, processing and manufacturing process, packaging, quality control process, labels and printing, warehouses, technology etc. are taken into account for licensing and for quality control.



# Reasonable Pricing


- ▶ It is necessary that the price of the drug is such that it can be accessed by the consumers at an affordable price. This is not only the duty of the drug manufacturer but also the government's duty to ensure that drug prices are not too high and especially that of essential medicines.



- Even though it is not explicitly given in the Constitution that there exists a right to health, the DPSP impose a duty on the State to take necessary steps to promote the welfare of the people which is impossible without good health.
  - Article 38 of Indian Constitution impose liability on State that states will secure a social order for the promotion of welfare of the people but without public health we cannot achieve it.
  - Article 47 makes improvement of public health a primary duty of State.



# Right to reasonable pricing


- The pricing policy of the manufacturers should be in accordance with the policies of the Government (such as National Drug Policy, National Pharmaceutical Policy etc.). This is to ensure that consumers are able to afford and access medicines or drugs- especially essential drugs.
- 

- 
- 
- The supply of essential medicines or drugs, is a duty of the Manufacturer, as regulated by the Government
  - The Government determines constitutes of essential drugs.
  - The concept of Essential Drugs us based on equity and promotes the health care system, quality of health care and pharmaceutical growth in a country.
  - Thus, it is the right of every consumer to obtain drugs at affordable rates.







# Duties of Manufacturers

- The duty of the manufacturers is to prevent and avoid exploitation of consumers by unethical trade practices, unfair pricing policies and illegal or unethical competition.
  - There are many major legislations or policies addressing the issue.
- 



# Drug Price Control Order

- The recent Drugs (Prices Control) Order (DCPO), 2013, elaborates the mechanisms to maintain a sustainable price in the market. Price control should be balanced to suit the interest of the company and the public welfare and health of consumers. Thus, setting of price ceilings, regulating prices of essential drugs etc. should be analysed from an economic perspective, as well.

- 
- 
- Under the provisions of the Drugs (Prices Control) Order, the prices of drugs and the formulations containing any of certain 'scheduled drugs' are controlled. National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA) fixes or revises prices of scheduled drugs or formulations as per the provisions of the DPCO.
  - The NPPA monitors the prices of all formulations, including imported scheduled formulations under price control. Under the provisions of DPCO, 1995, no person is authorized to sell any scheduled formulation (medicine) to a consumer at a price exceeding the price notified or approved by the NPPA.





# The Impact of Rising Drugs Costs on Consumers

- ▶ According to an American consumer report journal, rising drugs costs imposes a huge burden on the consumers that they choose to opt for desperate measures to put up with the high costs.



High drugs costs affects Indian Consumers in the following ways-


1. Spending less on leisure activities
2. Cutting down on outdoor dining
3. Cutting down on groceries
4. Increased use of credit cards
5. Post payment of other bills
6. Postponing retirement
7. Take a second job




➤ On the health front, the following are the risks involved-

1. Reducing the intake of drugs as opposed to the prescribed amount
2. Splitting of the pills without consulting the doctor
3. Skip an appointment with the doctor
4. Avoid further medical tests and procedure
5. Shifting to substitute medication

# Conclusion

- In our research we can conclude that right to safety of a consumer means that the manufacturer has a duty to ensure safety and consumers' right to reasonable price imposes a duty on the manufacturer to price the product at a reasonable rate in the interest of the public. It can also be said that the rights of the consumers can be protected only if all the actors in the pharmaceutical sector (drug manufacturers, State, pharmacists, medical practitioners, etc) work towards a common goal. It is especially important for State to implement policies and work closely with the drug manufacturers to fix the price of the drug.



##### **Student Aid Scholarship to economically backward meritorious students in the institution**

The Janatha Education Society is a registered society started in the year 1972 by a few educationists & philanthropist with a view to serve the cause of education in Karnataka. It is presently managing 15 institutions at 4 different campuses. All the institutions are named after the great philosopher educationalist & Youth icon Vivekananda to emulate his principles.

It was observed by Janatha Education Society (JES) from applications of students received for admission to various institutions managed by it, that some of the applicants belong to poor families in the neighbourhood & a major chunk of them commute everyday from nearby rural places for pursuing their education. It was evident that the parents found it extremely hard to admit their wards to 5 Year or 3 year LL.B Programmes. This plight of the parents set some of the members of the management, with a philanthropic bent of mind, to contemplate about the measures that could be adopted by the institution to reduce the burden of such parents by extending financial support to some of the merited students by conceptualizing STUDENT AID FUND SCHEME.

Janatha Education Society, has conceptualised the student Aid Fund Scheme with a motto to fulfil the constitutional goal of SOCIAL JUSTICE.

The founder members of JES thought it apt to constitute a corpus fund through voluntary donations from members, the proceeds of which are to be utilized to grant STUDENT AID SCHOLARSHIPS to some of the economically backward meritorious students of the 15 educational institutions, in proportion to the strength of each of the institutions through the constitution of a body called Student Aid Committee.

The Student Aid Committee constituted notifies each of the 15 institutions to invite applications from students for grant of Student Aid Scholarship, every academic year. The Committee holds a meeting with the heads of institutions to determine the number of applications received, in order to apportion the interest amount to each of institutions for conferring Scholarships. Each of the institution identifies deserving candidates on the basis of merit & economic backwardness & recommends the same to the Student Aid Committee for due approval & sanction.

The Committee through an interview with the enlisted number of students & their parents finalises the list of candidates for grant of scholarship in a uniform & transparent manner.

Janatha Education Society has rendered 50 years of glorious service in providing education at affordable cost. THE STUDENT AID FUND SCHOLARSHIP conferred by Janatha Education Society is both innovative & unique in the sense that it is available to students with merit & economic backwardness & for those who do not enjoy the benefit of government endowed scholarships based on caste or gender.

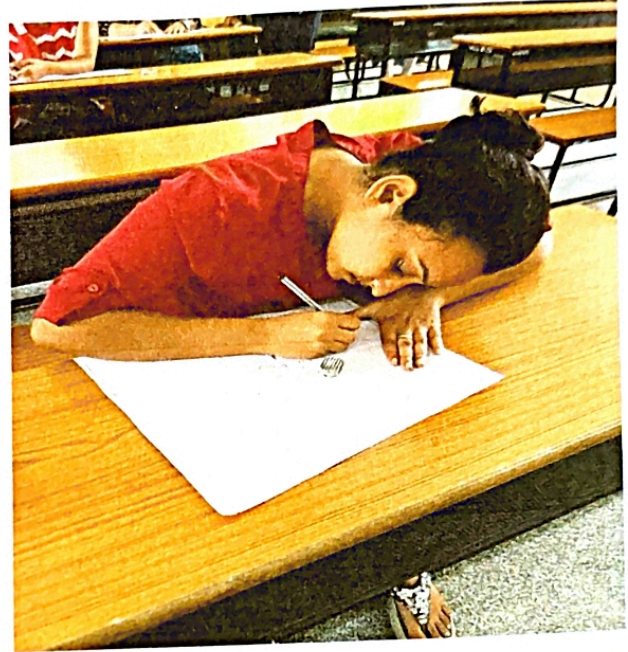

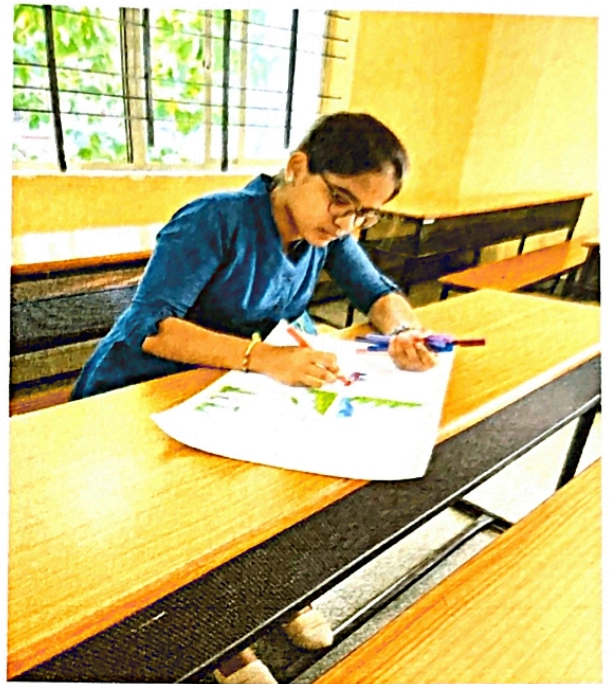
