Late Kengal Hanumanthaiah, the leading visionary and statesman of Indian Independence era was born in 1908. early in life as a student he plunged into the freedom struggle and was involved with the independence movement with great zeal and courage. In 1932 he passed out of the Law College with LL.B. Degree from Pune. He elected to highest office of the state as Chief Minister from 1952 to 1956. Kengal Hanumanthaiya Foundation was established in 1994 in memory of a great Statesman of India Late Sri. Kengal Hanumanthaiya, Former Chief Minister of Karnataka, Former Union Minister and Former Chairman, Administrative Reforms Commission, Government of India. This Foundation was founded by his daughter Smt. Vijayalakshmi Thimmaiah with the sole objective of pursuing his ideals and mission. It is a non-profit organization. It is engaged in the task of cultural, educational, economic and social development for the benefit of humanity, to enable to live in dignity, harmony and peace. on the foundation's agenda are various programs that deal with National and International issues related to women, children and youth, periodically organizes Conferences, Seminars and Symposiums on International and National issues aiming towards socio-economic progress for the benefit of the people.

Hon'ble Justice S.R. Bannurmath delivering the Lecture

Justice Bannurmath has delivered lecture on the topic 'Revisiting Kesavananda Bharti Case; Brief History and Unique, Unusual Factors. He has addressed the invaluable insights into its historical significance and distinctive features, prompting a thought provoking discourse among the attendees. He spoke that 'The Constitution of India' is a living organic document. Article 368 grants power to the constitutional implementation authority to amend or repeal. Article 13(2) mandates that any law inconsistent with the Constitution is void. Legal precedents such as the Shankar Prasad case and the Shajjan Singh case established Parliament's authority to amend any provision of the law. The Golaknath case challenged Parliament's power to amend fundamental rights.

He also spoke on the landmark Kesavananda Bharati case ruled that Parliament cannot amend the Constitution's basic features. Notable cases like Bank Nationalization and R.C. Cooper v. Union of India highlighted judicial review and the protection of fundamental rights. The Kerala Land Reform Act, 1971, put in the 9th schedule, was deemed unchallengeable in courts. Justice H.R. Khanna's historic judgment emphasized the doctrine of basic structure, including supremacy of the Constitution, federalism, and free and fair elections. Despite confusion, the judgment clarified that fundamental rights are part of the basic structure. Certainly, here's a merged summary of the additional points discussed by Justice Bannurmath: In the Kesavananda Bharati case, the judgment was divided 7:6, allowing amendments to the Constitution without changing its basic features for socio-legal justice.

Justice H.R. Khanna delivered a historic 700-page judgment, addressing unanimous, dissenting, and concurrent opinions among the 11 judges. Despite nine judges signing a unanimous judgment, four refused, leading to the matter being remitted to all 13 judges. Basic structure,

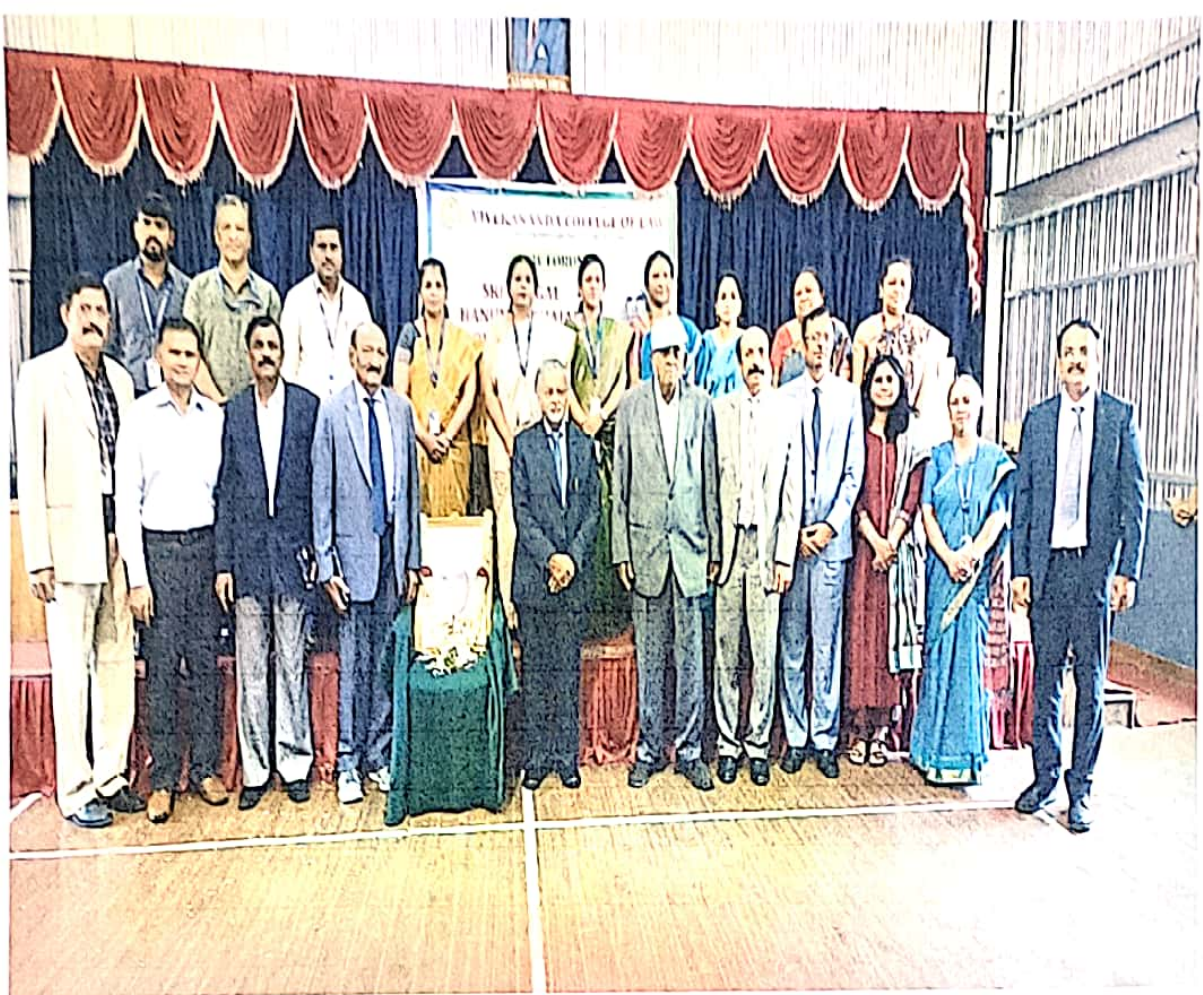

including the supremacy of the Constitution, federalism, and free and fair elections, was central to the case. Despite the victory for democracy, the case marked a black day during the Emergency under Indira Gandhi. Nanepalke Vala represented Kesavananda Bharati in court for 68 days without directly meeting him. Justice Khanna expressed confusion about fundamental rights' inclusion in the basic structure. Nana Saheb Palke noted that Justice Khanna's judgment didn't align with either state or people's interests but became the law of the land. The bench was dissolved by the Chief Justice of India on the third day of assembly, refusing to take up the case further. The dissolution of the bench in the Indira Gandhi case underscored the complexity of judicial interpretation.

The Chief Guest has started his lecture on 'Significance of Procedural Law in Practice'. First he has shared his experience. He spoke on the Gandhi's philosophy and expressed his gratitude to all the dignitaries on the dais. He started his lecture on procedural law he says that court can formulate his own procedures when there is no procedure to that aspect. Paramount interest of minor is important. The legal guardian of minors is the court. He said that cross examination is not merely a procedure but when we observe more of cross examination by others and learn from it.

He says that in India, laws are made by Parliament and State Legislatures, implemented by executives and judged by the judiciary. Article-21 says that 'no person can be deprived of his life and personal liberty except according to procedure established by law. It means

courts can make some procedural law and rules of evidence. Jurisdictional courts can adopt their own procedure subject to equality, principles of Natural justice.

He emphasized on 'Due process of law means transparent and just legal procedures as said in the Maneka Gandhi case. He said that according to Salmond, law that governs the litigation is a procedural law while substantive law relates to the purposes and subject matter of litigation.

He says there are two kinds of procedural laws such as civil and criminal procedure. Procedural law is to ensure the justice balancing the power of one sided litigants, to appreciate evidence, to have consistent fairness.

He spoke on interpretation of Supreme Court that the procedural aspect should not cause hindrance to the society as per the Keshavananda Bharti Case. Procedural law lays down the rules which should be followed in litigation. He has given various examples of how procedural laws were applied by the courts in India.

highlighting the critical need for societies to recognize and address the severe impacts of climate change. He drew attention to the recent heat waves in the USA, where heat shelters have been established to protect vulnerable populations. Unfortunately, despite many global measures, 20 people recently died due to extreme heat and poor air quality caused by smog in Delhi.

He vividly described the alarming situation of the Yamuna River, which recently flooded Raj Ghat and reached the premises of the Supreme Court. This incident underscored the urgent need for comprehensive environmental policies. Sri Hegde praised the Supreme Court of India for its progressive stance in recognizing the right to be free from the adverse effects of climate change as a distinct and enforceable right. This landmark decision marks a significant step towards ensuring that environmental protection is integral to the protection of human rights.

Sri Nagesh Hegde further elaborated on the global trends of environmental degradation and their disproportionate impact on marginalized communities. He emphasized that protecting the environment is not merely a policy issue but a moral imperative that requires collective action from governments, civil society, and individuals. His address served as a powerful reminder of the interconnectedness of human rights and environmental health, urging immediate and sustained efforts to safeguard both.

SESSION 1: RIGHT TO A HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT - A CRITICAL STUDY

The first session, chaired by Prof. Dr. C. S Patil, Director (Research), KILPAR, featured two distinguished speakers: *Prof. Dr. B.C. Nagaraj*, Professor & Chairman, Department of Environmental Science, Bangalore University, Bengaluru. *Prof. Dr. Reddivari Revathi*, Former Professor at Dr. Ambedkar Law University, Tamil Nadu.

Dr. B.C. Nagaraj, presented on topic "Public Participation in Environmental Impact Assessments in India - An Overview," from 12:10 PM to 12:30 PM. Dr. Nagaraj emphasized the crucial role of public involvement in environmental governance, scrutinizing the government's actions to ensure sustainable development.

He highlighted the importance of global conferences in shaping environmental policies and the need for rigorous environmental analysis, which has been implemented through laws in many countries. Dr. Nagaraj referred to the 1972 Stockholm Conference, where Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister of India, notably underscored the significance of environmental protection. Dr. Nagaraj also cited Sri. Jawaharlal Nehru's famous assertion that "Dams are the temples of modern India," reflecting the historical perspective on development projects. He noted that, until the 1980s, India had minimal environmental laws, with significant progress beginning only after the 1978 guidelines for river valley projects and the 1984 regulations for thermal power and highway projects. His presentation highlighted the Bhopal Gas Tragedy as a turning point in India's environmental legislation. It was only after this disaster that the Environmental Protection Act came into force, serving as an umbrella law for all subsequent environmental regulations, including the Water Act and Air Act. Dr. Nagaraj elaborated on the components of Environmental Impact Assessments (EIA), which encompass both physical and social environments, stressing the necessity for comprehensive evaluations to prevent ecological harm and ensure public well-being.

Prof. Dr. Reddivari Revathi, presented a comprehensive analysis on "Right to a Healthy Environment - A Critical Study," from 12:30 PM to 12:50 PM. Her discussion underscored the profound implications of environmental law on human health and wellbeing. Dr. Revathi began by emphasizing the adage, "If health is lost, wealth is lost," highlighting the intrinsic value of health over material wealth. She elaborated on the critical issues of biomedical waste and e-waste adulteration, which pose severe threats to public health and the environment. These types of waste not only contaminate soil and water but also lead to serious health issues, making their proper management essential. She also discussed the constitutional mandates that underpin environmental protection in India. Article 21 of the Indian Constitution guarantees the right to life, which the judiciary has interpreted to include the right to a healthy environment. Additionally, Article 48A mandates the state to protect and improve the environment and safeguard the forests and wildlife of the country.

Dr. Revathi highlighted that it is also a fundamental duty of every citizen under Article 51A(g) to protect and improve the natural environment, including forests, lakes, rivers, and wildlife, and to have compassion for living creatures. Her analysis included a discussion on the legal frameworks that support these constitutional mandates. Dr. Revathi stressed the importance of stringent

environmental laws and their enforcement to ensure the protection of human health. She highlighted that the protection of the environment is not just a policy issue but a fundamental duty and a necessary condition for the sustenance of human life. Dr. Revathi's presentation was a compelling call to action for stronger environmental governance and public awareness. She advocated for robust legal measures and active public participation in environmental protection as essential steps towards ensuring a healthy environment for present and future generations. Her insights reinforced the seminar's theme of linking human rights with environmental law, demonstrating that the well-being of individuals is deeply interconnected with the health of the environment.

SESSION 2: ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE AND HUMAN RIGHTS

The second session, chaired by Prof. Dr. C.S. Patil, Director (Research), KILPAR, Bengaluru, featured two distinguished speakers: **Prof. Dr. Ragunath Reddy**, Former Professor at Dr. Ambedkar Law University, Tamil Nadu. **Prof. Dr. M.K Ramesh**, Former Professor at NLSIU, Bengaluru.

Prof. Dr. Ragunath Reddy delivered an insightful presentation on "Environmental Impact on Renewable Energy Resources," from 12:50 PM to 1:00 PM. Dr. Ragunath Reddy explored the critical balance between meeting energy needs and ensuring environmental sustainability. He emphasized the potential of renewable energy sources, such as solar and wind power, to mitigate environmental degradation and reduce dependence on fossil fuels. However, he also pointed out the environmental challenges associated with renewable energy projects, such as habitat disruption and resource consumption. Dr. Reddy called for innovative solutions and comprehensive environmental assessments to minimize the ecological footprint of renewable energy initiatives, advocating for policies that promote sustainable development and environmental stewardship. Prof. Dr. M.K. Ramesh, addressed the seminar on "Environmental Justice and Human Rights," from 1:00PM to 1:30 PM underscoring the importance of equitable environmental policies and their impact on marginalized communities. Dr. Ramesh referred to the Love Canal case, a landmark environmental disaster in the United States that highlighted the need for robust environmental regulations and justice for affected communities. He emphasized the rule of environmental law as a cornerstone for pollution control and the establishment of institutions dedicated to environmental protection. Dr. Ramesh stressed that these institutions must be accessible to all citizens to ensure inclusive environmental governance. He highlighted the significance of Articles 49A and 39(b) and (c) of the Indian Constitution, which mandate the state to protect the environment and ensure that resources are distributed to serve the common good without discrimination.

Dr. Ramesh argued that environmental justice entails not only the equitable distribution of environmental benefits and burdens but also the protection of the rights of marginalized groups who are disproportionately affected by environmental degradation. He criticized the illegal exploitation of rivers and other natural resources, emphasizing that it is the basic obligation of the state to prevent such practices and uphold environmental laws. He concluded by asserting that achieving environmental justice requires comprehensive policies that address the root causes of environmental inequities and ensure that all citizens have the right to access natural resources without restriction. His presentation called for stronger legal frameworks and active public participation to achieve true environmental justice and protect human rights in the context of environmental governance.

LUNCH BREAK: A lunch break was scheduled from 1:30 PM to 2:00 PM, providing attendees with an opportunity to network and discuss the morning sessions. A special arrangement of lunch was made on the campus, ensuring that all participants and students were well catered to.

STUDENT PAPER PRESENTATIONS: After the lunch break, the seminar transitioned into a session dedicated to paper presentations from faculty members & students of various law colleges, both online and offline. This segment allowed students to showcase their research and insights on topics related to environmental law and human rights, fostering an engaging and collaborative academic environment. Further, to motivate students & encourage them to excel, prizes were awarded to 3 best presentations.
